A WORD from the Pastor

Extravagant Love

In John 12:1-11 we read about a dinner party given in Jesus' honor. This dinner took place on the evening before the triumphant entry, that event we celebrate on Palm Sunday. Two people at this dinner party, Mary and Judas, stand in stark contrast to one another and serve as great illustrations for us. I believe it may surprise us to learn that we often act more like Judas than we would like to admit. Oh, that we could all love Jesus like Mary!

Consider Judas: he had spent 3 years with Jesus. He had been instructed by Jesus, heard him teach, and seen him perform many miraculous signs. Judas had undoubtedly been involved in critical ministry and mission work himself as one of Jesus' closest confidants. Yet, only a few days before the crucifixion we see Judas acting in a cold, calculating manner. His affection for Jesus had grown cold and waned over the years. Despite the fact that he had been around Jesus and His followers and witnessed his power and might, he was self-focused and willing to betray.

There are many today who have been around the Lord's people, been in the church, heard the Gospel, and seen love in action, yet they still refuse to receive Jesus and embrace Him as Lord and Savior. Others began strong as followers of Jesus, but had lost that zeal and focus. On a certain level, these people are no different than Judas the betrayer. Whatever it is, that is keeping you from going all in for Jesus and loving him with abandon is the price of your betrayal. Yes. We all have moments where we fall short and lose focus and fail to live up to our calling in Christ. How do you respond in those moments? Like Judas, do you deflect and make excuses as he did in John 12:5, or do you confess your sin and turn back to Jesus?

Now consider Mary: Mary's love for Jesus had grown deep; her commitment to Him was strong. This story shares that Mary gave a costly gift to the Lord. Even though she was criticized by others, she loved Jesus with abandon. Mary was not cold and calculating like Judas; she loved extravagantly, and Jesus commended her love.

Which character of this story are you most like? Are you cold and calculating in how you approach your love and service to the Lord? Or, like Mary, do you love Jesus with abandon?

This is something we should all consider as we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection this Sunday.
