from surgery. These past five weeks would have been very lonely for me if not for your love and friendship. I thank God for all of you – especially the Mary Martha Class.



Jackson Memorial Baptist Church is a member of the Portsmouth Baptist Association and contributes \$750.00 per month to PBA's missions and ministries. (\$750 X 12 = \$9000/yr.)

JMBC is also a member or the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV) and in 2016 contributed a total of \$41,033.37 to cooperative missions (7.25% of total offerings received).

Total JMBC budget giving overage for 2016 was about \$42,600, which was held over and sent out to various missions and ministries in early 2017.

So, adding \$9,000 + \$41,033 + \$42,600 gives a total missions offering of \$92,633 for JMBC for 2016!

Therefore, JMBC is a mission/ministry minded congregation that gives to local, state, national and international missions – for the purpose of LEADING people to Christ, HELPING them become fully devoted followers of Christ, EQUIPPING them for ministry and missions and MAGNIFYING God's name in worship and praise.
