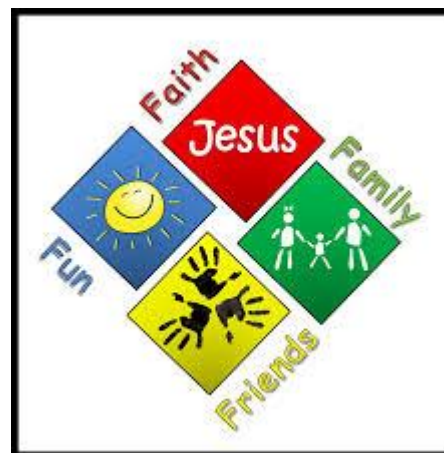

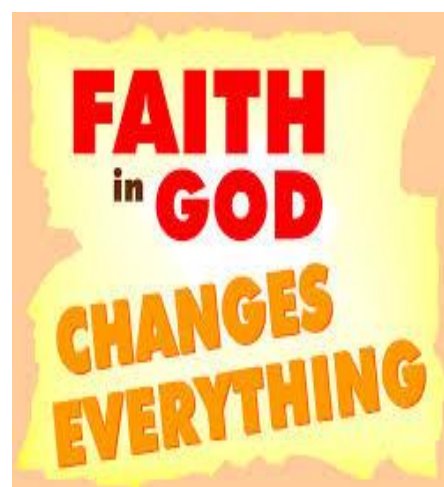

Contentment and Ambition

This past Sunday we talked a lot about greed and contentment from 1 Timothy 6:6-12. The point of the message was that contentment will never come through money and possessions, but contentment is learned as we grow in our relationship with Christ. When we are growing to be more like Jesus we will possess true wealth, a wealth not subject to market downturns, theft, or job loss.

But this does raise an interesting question. Does all of this talk about contentment mean that I am to have no ambition? Is it wrong or sinful or greedy to work hard and achieve great things? The short answer to that question is no! Pursuing godliness through a growing walk with Jesus does not mean that we are to forsake all of our other God-given responsibilities, including the responsibility to work hard and make the most of our talents and abilities. It does, however, change the lens through which we view and judge success. After all, we are commanded in Colossians 3:23 to work heartily for the Lord in everything we do. Christians ought to be the hardest working and most faithful employees in any situation. Christians must be faithful to use their God-given talents and abilities in the opportunities they are afforded.

However, Colossians 3:23 is very specific; our hard work is *for* the Lord. This means that the driving force behind all we do is His glory. Success is defined ultimately then by His glory and not our achievements. You may get passed over for a promotion, but you can still be a success in God's eyes as you continue to serve faithfully and resist envy and bitterness. Your business may be struggling, but you may still be profitable in the Lord's accounting as you conduct your affairs in honesty.

In addition, godly ambition means that when we do find worldly success and get that promotion and receive the accolades we understand that it is also all about God and for His glory. What about that extra income? Yep, it's for His purposes and glory and the furthering of the Great Commission. The increase in responsibility and influence, it is to be used in a manner that honors Him. Any success we enjoy is not the end but is only a means to the end, which is God's glory.

In short, we are to work hard and do our best. We are not to be afraid of or ashamed of success, but we always see it through the lens of Colossians 3:23 and understand that it is ultimately for the Lord. No matter our job, career or earthly calling I pray we all can have the same ultimate ambition as that of Paul in Romans 15:20, "I make it my ambition to preach the gospel." May all we do ultimately serve to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
