## Back to School Review

I always despised and grew bored with beginning of the school year review time. I was a good student and found that boredom led to trouble. I never will forget a phone call my mom got from a teacher who lamented the fact I deserved a grade in conduct/behavior that would prohibit me from having all A's. The teacher eventually showed me grace and gave me an A-and I subsequently made straight A's the entire year, always with an A- in conduct/behavior.

However, I now understand the importance of the beginning of the year review time. Ask any teacher, and they will explain that reviewing allows them to, not only assess the student's progress to that point, but it also allows them to ensure that every student has a foundation of knowledge that will help them move forward in their learning.

In honor of back to school review time, I want to do a little review of my own. There are some basics that we all need to know or be reminded of in order to move forward together as a church. Hopefully you will behave better than I did and pay attention!

These review items are based on the reality that it's all about Jesus and doing His work in the world, which is summarized in our church's mission statement as follows:

"Grounded in the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20), our Mission is to **lead** people to Christ; to **help** them become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ; to **equip** them for ministry and missions; and to **magnify** God's name in worship."

Review item #1: It is important that you faithfully gather with your church family. The Bible clearly commands this in Hebrews 10:24-25, and Jesus assumed we faithfully would gather as seen in Matthew 18:15-18. Paul also assumed that gathering would be the norm and gave many instructions that govern these times together. Furthermore, the early church, under the leadership of the apostles, was faithful to gather regularly. We gather to make much of God and lift up our Savior. We gather to learn. We gather to encourage one another. We gather to fellowship and hold one another accountable. We gather to build one another up for the cause of the Lord Jesus. Gathering together, or "attending church," should not be merely one of many activity options for a beautiful Sunday or weekend. It should not take a back seat to our hobbies. (Yes, sometimes we are providentially hindered from attending. No, it's not wrong to go on vacation now and then. That is not what review item #1 is about.)

Review item #2: Each and every Christian has a role to play in the ministry of the Lord's church. As a follower of the Lord Jesus, the Holy Spirit dwells in you and has gifted you for service in His church. That is clear teaching of 1 Corinthians 12:7. Paul goes on to teach that each of us is vital and "indispensable" to the Lord's work in verse 22 of the same chapter. Christian, you are a member of the Lord's body. Are you functioning well and doing your part? The old adage that a small percentage of members do most of the work may be true, but it is not pleasing to the Lord.

Review item #3: God expects us to give back to His work. Every good gift comes from above, the Bible states, and that includes our abilities, talents and opportunities to earn a living and produce wealth. Giving is an act of worship where we recognize this reality and give back to the Lord what is already His. The Bible assumes we will gather and that we will give, and Paul reiterates this in 1 Corinthians 16:2. The Apostle then teaches about giving in 2 Corinthians 8 and 9 where the principle put forth is giving cheerfully and sacrificially. The church is God's ordained institution to do His work in the world, and ministry requires resources.


