SUNDAY, MARCH 10TH 2:00 am

One of my favorite and most cherished descriptors for Christians is found in 2 Corinthians 5:20 - "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors." Although I talk about our role as ambassadors often, I am certain many of us (myself included) do not fathom the depth, importance and privilege of bearing this title. We are Christ's ambassadors!

Christ's Ambassadors and Reconciliation

If there was any doubt what Paul meant by referring to Christ-followers as "ambassadors." it is cleared up later in the same verse. Paul writes, "as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be Reconciled to God." The implication is clear - we are God's mouthpiece in the world. We are expected to live in such a way that others want the same salvation we have through Christ. Our ultimate responsibility is to share the love of God that is proven in the Gospel of Christ.

Christians often protest and declare that sharing Christ is the job of evangelists, pastors, and missionaries. This passage nullifies that idea, for verse 17 declares that this new title, position and responsibility of "ambassador" is for "anyone in Christ." Christian, you have a great responsibility. You have literally been entrusted by God to lead others to a right relationship with Him. You bear the title "ambassador for Christ."

The practical implications here are many, but I want to touch on one now. To begin, as people charged with bringing others into reconciliation with God through Jesus Christ (reconciliation with God means the relationship is restored and brought back to a right standing) we must practice reconciliation in our human relationships. In other words, how can we lead someone to know reconciliation with God if we refuse to reconcile with them? Why would a family member, friend, neighbor, co-worker, church member or casual acquaintance want to know the God we claim to know if we cannot or will not strive to set our relationship with them in order?

Ultimate reconciliation is with God, but the practical ramification of our relationship with the Lord and salvation is played out with others. Are you harboring resentment toward others? Are you hanging on to the past hurt or indiscretions of others? While the hurt you have experienced is real and you may have been woefully treated, you must seek reconciliation with them for the cause of Christ.

How do we begin down this path? First, pray and ask the Lord to help you see others the way He sees them. In other words, if they are Christians they are ultimately righteous in Christ, and His blood has paid for their sin. If they are not Christians they need the forgiveness that comes through Christ, and you can trust that God is the one to whom they ultimately will give account. All this means you can let "love cover over a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8). You can and ought to let it go because of the Gospel. Next, the situation may dictate you go to them to ask forgiveness or work things out. If this is the case, go in humility. Go with a heart to reconcile, not with a heart to prove you are right and they are wrong. Finally, remember God's love for you. Remember and focus on the grace and mercy He gave you in Christ. Remember that God is the most offended and sinned against being in all the world and all of time. Yet, He went to great lengths to bring about and allow us to reconcile with Him.

My encouragement for each of us now - ponder the reconciliation we have with God through Jesus Christ, and pray God will lead us to live lives of reconciliation with others. Ask Him to reveal unreconciled relationships in our lives, and do it for the cause of Christ.


