

Are you at least 70½? Are you taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from an IRA, or will you be taking one in the future? RMDs count as taxable income. If you donate to a qualified charity, such as JMBC, with a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from your IRA, the distribution is excluded from your taxable income. A QCD is a <u>direct transfer</u> of funds from your IRA, <u>payable directly</u> to a qualified charity. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000.

Here are the QCD rules:

- The QCD must come from a Traditional or Inherited IRA (not a 401k or a pension).
- The IRA beneficiary taking the RMD must be at least 70½.
- The distribution must go <u>directly</u> to a qualified charity. Funds cannot be deposited in a personal bank account and then given to a charity or church to get this tax exclusion.
- A confirmation letter from the charity or church must be issued that states no goods or services were received in exchange for the contribution.
- An individual who itemizes deductions on a federal tax return may not also count the QCD given to a church in their total church giving for the year.

If you meet the minimum age, own an IRA, and would like to give from your RMD to JMBC, a QCD may be an option you wish to use. Be sure to check with your accountant or tax preparer.
